

Guidelines for Bus Stop Locations

Transportation to and from school shall be furnished to students who live more than one and one-half (1.5) miles from the school to which they have been assigned.

Routes shall be established so that no bus stop, for otherwise eligible students, shall be more than one and one-half (1.5) miles from a student's driveway.

These distances are determined by the nearest and best route from the junction of the driveway of the student's home and the nearest public road, to the nearest door of the schoolhouse, or bus stop, he/she is assigned, as the case may be.

Between bus stops, the minimum distance must be sufficient to properly signal and warn traffic that the school bus will be making a stop.

Non-Transportation Zones: Areas designated by the School District Board of Directors to be impractical by reason of; sparsity of students, remoteness, or condition of roads, to serve established routes. School buses shall not be required to travel any road not maintained as a part of a highway district, county, state or federal highway system, or by the state or national forest service.
